Old Town Hall

Built in 1798, Old Town Hall served as the center of local government and community activities for more than 100 years. By 1916, city government had outgrown Town Hall and sold the building to the Delaware Historical Society. Today this beautiful, historic building is used for rotating exhibits, meetings, special events, and event rentals.
