[APRIL 9, 1943]

Dear Lee:-

When I got home with daddy about midnight last night we found that a letter from you had come out on the 9 o'clock mail, the one addressed to Bernice. At the same time a letter which I sent you airmail last Saturday was returned, stating that you were not there. I suppose it reached Sioux City before you did. I am enclosing it. It may take you a while to figure out the sequence of all these notes, clippings, etc., but I am sending them nevertheless.

I'm glad you enjoyed the trip out and hope you will soon be settled in permanent quarters. Shirley will try to write you over the weekend. She seems so busy with school, music, etc. Last night she went to Newark to see a play which Mr. Durkee put on. She'll tell you more about it when she writes.

I want daddy to take this in town with him so will close.
