September 14, 1943

We just finished a G.I. clean up party in our bungalow. General Kinkaid is coming here for three days so we have to be on the ball even more than usual.

This is really nice writing paper and it came just at the time when my other ran out. Tell Shirley and Bernice thanks.

Enclosed you will find fifty dollars which you can save for me. Yesterday I waited in line for forty five minutes so that I could get the \$3.75 for meals from Santa Ana to Thunderbird.

It seems that luck just isn't with the Blue Rocks this year. What are their chances in the playoffs?

Tell Bernice or Shirley to relay my congratulations to Kathryn Maxwell will you please?

As there a trolley strike in  
Wilmington. You mentioned something  
about it in one of your letters.

No, we never have a chance  
to listen to a radio and there  
are no reliable papers to be  
had - a local and Hearst's Los  
Angeles paper. And Phoenix is  
such an overcrowded town  
that only 50% of the upper class  
go in on weekends.

Yesterday I had letters from  
Mike Zographone and Daisy.  
Some sort of movie is beginning  
in five minutes so I'll close.
