Last night for dinner Bernice brought home Caroline Denning, Walter, and John Meadman. They all had to practice at 7:30 for the operetta, after which Caroline came home with Bernice to spend the night.

Today at noon daddy has to preside at the Lenten services; and at 6:30 he speaks at the Claymont Lion's Club. Yesterday he and Mr. Hamm went to Dover in the afternoon to attend legislature. I see by the morning paper that state workers have been voted an increase in pay, ranging from \$150 to \$200 a year.

You remember the Ralph George's in Concord, don't you? We have received an invitation to Millicent's wedding this coming Saturday. How I wish we could accept.

I mailed two rolls of film to you yesterday and I hope they are not too long arriving. I am going to try to get a box off to you, also, with something in it which you can enjoy.

By this time I suppose you are back on the job again. Are you doing the same thing, -that is going on missions; or do you have a different assignment? Love
