This time I have to go by train, which is not too good especially on a weekend and at a time when we are all being urged to save trains for the movement of troops.

We have had the Blue Hen Chick pictures developed and they are fine.

We ordered tickets for the Brandywiners last night. To be on the safe side we have ordered two for you, - one for each night. We can easily get rid of the extra ticket if necessary. Beginning next week the girls will have to practice three nights a week.

It seems too good to be true that before many days you will be at home again. Judy and May will be home by that time, of course; and Ben Johns is planning to come to Wilmington sometime in July I think, so we will be having a regular "old home week".
