Immigrants Welcome! Pop Up Museum

Wilmington, DE – In commemoration of Immigrant Heritage Month, the Delaware Historical Society is hosting a Pop Up Museum on Saturday, June 3, 2017 from 1 p.m.– 3 p.m. at the Delaware History Museum.

A Pop Up Museum is a temporary exhibit created solely by the guests who contribute to it. Participants are invited to bring a small- to medium-sized object that represents the theme “Immigrants Welcome.” The object can be anything meaningful that tells the story of immigration past or present. The Pop Up will run from 1 p.m. – 3 p.m., but participants are asked to arrive by 12:30 p.m. to set up. Spend the afternoon sharing stories, meeting other participants and visitors, and celebrating Delaware’s diverse cultural heritage!

Guests are also invited to bring a photograph of themselves to a new, temporary, “Faces of Delaware” photo exhibit in Old Town Hall, which will remain on display all month.

Participants contributing an object for the Pop Up Museum receive Free Admission—one object per person is required for free admission.
