Dean Hitchler and Gilbert Malcom were with us from Carlisle. They spoke well. It was a fine affair. I am enclosing a clipping covering it.

Governor Bacon and I saw four innings of the A's - Phil's opener. Not much occurred to write about. But there was a very large crowd - indicating the public's interest in sport. I hope we can keep things moving during this war period. I think a good ball game does more for health than "the apple a day" that is spoken of so often.

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"Bill" Rogers had lunch with me yesterday. He has had three round trips under water to Casablanca - and let this morning for a fourth. He sent his regards. Walter Hall, colored boy, is in Camp Eustace - he said hello "as one soldier to another." That's something, isn't it. When I read his letter to the Board of Trustees they got a great laugh out of it.

Work at the school is tougher because of the help problem. I have to coach baseball. There is actually no one else on the grounds who can do it. "Jeff" got off the "straight and narrow" again, and I had to let him go. It's a pity - but, as he said, I had given him more chances than anyone else would have given him.
