Dear Lee:

Shirley's trunk went off this morning, and we will take her up Sunday afternoon I guess. She must be there by Monday for registration, etc., and classes start on Tuesday.

Daddy left for N.Y. today to be gone until tomorrow night.

By this time I suppose you have received your copy of the Dickinson Alumnus which I forwarded yesterday. I don't know what daddy did with Ede's letter. If I come across it I will send it along. I think Dr. Corson's letter on The President's Page is a most timely one. Daddy said he would like to run over to Carlisle while we are on the trip with Shirley but it all depends on what time we have I guess. Williamsport is about a six hour trip from here I believe. We no longer have the Packard. It was getting to the place where it needed a lot of work done on it and we thought now was the time to get rid of it when such a good price can be gotten for used cars. I believe the government is putting a price on used cars in the near future. And since the gas rationing we have not been able to fill up the car here at the school as we used to be able to do, and you know how much gas it took. We are using the new Studebaker for ourselves and it is very comfortable. When the new cars are out after the war we will get one.

I gave your new address to Judy Reese, in the church office, so you should be receiving church bulletins again soon.

I saw in last night's paper that Tom Warren had graduated this week from the Medical school in Carlisle. By the way, have you met any doctors while at Thunderbird. Aunt Margaret Plummer tells me that Dr. McClean, who used to be Dr. Edgar Miller's assistant and who attended grandmother Jones one winter while the Millers were away,- in Europe I believe- is in the medical end of the air corps and is stationed in Phoenix. Inquire around and find out. You met him once, I believe. Our Thunderbird picture is scheduled for October 23.
