It's turned a little bit cooler here this morning after quite a thunder storm yesterday. We've had some very warm days here for the past week or two, almost like summer. I've started to play tennis in all my spare time and am quite crazy about it! Another girl and I play doubles with two of the profs and we really have quite a good time of it. We got up on Saturday morning at 6:30 so we could play before everything
