Do you know any more about your future yet. I don't see how Germany

can hold out longer, do you? We hear continually "firings" & see clouds of smoke over the water. I suppose it is from Ft. Miles.

The girls say the Lattmuses are here. Bob has been given a Medical discharge, on account of his asthma, which was aggravated when he was sent to Texas. I think he will return to Delaware. I noticed an overseas cap in your closet before I left. Do you want it sent to you?

I want daddy to drive down with both grandmothers Sunday but I don't know whether he will. Charlotte, Gregg & Daugherty are spending the weekend with us.

The Boykins returned to Wilm. last Sat. Daddy & Mr. Boykin went to Camden Mon. while the girls & I shopped in Phila. The Boykins' nephew "Bill" has gone across.
