

Friday night, July 20
1945

Dearest Lee,

I arrived home late this afternoon, after a very busy four days trying to get over to adult women the plans + challenge of the W.S.C.S. Bernice + "Chapel" came down for me with Mr. Hamm. Your letter to Shirley, written July 6, was here when I came. By this time I hope our mail to you is coming through regularly. I learned that on Wed. night some one called from W. Chester - a former crew member of yours, I guess - expecting you to be here. Grandmother didn't seem to get the name, + I haven't had a chance to talk to daddy about it. He happened to come in the house before grandmother hung up + invited him + his wife down for dinner Sunday. I'll let you know what turns out to be, in case you can't guess.

Sallie Sterling of Cusifield was at Dover, asking all about you, - also

Mrs. Ada Landau. Do you remember her?
Grandmother Minkler had hot rolls
for dinner tonight. I guess she must be
practising on us in order to reach per-
fectly the time you arrive. We also
had corn from our farm - the first
this year.

We just heard a 15-minute program
over WDED - by the chorus + some of the
soloists in "Iolanthe". They surely are
working hard + must practise tomorrow -
Sat. - night, as well as Sunday after-
noon. Luckily, it hasn't been too hot
so far. Remember, we have a ticket for
you.

It has rained here every day for a
week + I guess much damage has been
done to the crops. It now looks as if it
is clearing, however.

Tonight's paper lists 3 Wilm. officers
of the 8th Airforce who have arrived on the
Queen Mary. Is that how you expect
to come? Love you from all of us.
